About Allan Purdy

Allan Walker Purdy was a visionary leader. Born in 1914 on a farm near Macon, Missouri, he was the first in his family to attend a four-year college. Mr. Purdy worked in the University of Missouri's College of Agriculture before becoming the campus's first director of scholarships and student financial aid. He was the founding president of the National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators and helped create the Missouri Higher Education Loan Authority (MOHELA), spending 20 years on MOHELA's governing board. Mr. Purdy's leadership in the financial aid industry is unparalleled. He believed in using one's voice and knowledge to help students and families obtain higher education.

PROGRAM

The Purdy Emerging Leaders Scholarship Program, named in honor of Allan Walker Purdy, is designed to provide scholarships to emerging leaders who are outstanding students and who have a need for additional resources for higher education. We are looking for leaders on Missouri college campuses! This scholarship supports candidates who demonstrate leadership, character and academic performance. Additionally, these students have a vision, are eager to make their contribution to the world and have the work ethic to bring their dreams to fruition.

ELIGIBILITY

- Must be considered a Missouri resident by the institution.
- Undergraduate sophomore, junior or senior attending a Missouri 4-year or 2-year higher education institution. See eligible schools list.
- Enrolled full-time and making satisfactory academic progress.
- Generally, a cumulative college GPA of 2.5 or higher is required.
- Student's EFC range as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will factor into decision. Unmet need will also be a factor.
- A recommendation from an instructor, counselor, advisor, supervisor or other similarly qualified individual at the institution is required.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- **Scholarship opportunity will open January 1 on My Scholarship Central.**
- Before you start, you will need a copy of your Student Aid Report (SAR) generated from the FASFA, your most recent college transcript, and your Financial Aid Award Offer from your school.
- Go to myscholarshipcentral.org/apply and click "Apply Now".
- On the top right of the page, click "Sign In" if you already have a My Scholarship Central account, or "Sign Up" if you've never used the site.
- Enter your email and password. If you are a new user, you will receive a confirmation email and must click the link in the email to validate your account.
- Complete the General Application if you have not done so this year.
- After submitting the General Application, you should see the Purdy Emerging Leaders Scholarship on your list of Recommended Opportunities. If not, click "Opportunities" in the blue bar and choose "Ours." Search "Purdy".
- Click the orange "Apply" button next to the opportunity name. After completing the application, click "submit" at the bottom right of the page.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Scholarships are available at the discretion of the Missouri Scholarship & Loan Foundation in accordance with program rules and applicable law. All scholarship applications will be considered, provided that funding designated for this program remains available.
- Program funding will be determined annually by the Missouri Scholarship & Loan Foundation. The Purdy Emerging Leaders Scholarship is renewable for up to a total of three years. If funding is available, scholarship recipients from the previous years will be invited to apply for renewal using a special application.
- Applicants will be notified if a scholarship is awarded via My Scholarship Central. If awarded, MSLF will verify eligibility with the institution. The scholarship must be used to cover the Cost of Attendance as determined by the school.
- If this award is used for educational expenses that are not required for your academic program, such as housing, meals or transportation, your scholarship may be considered taxable income. You should consult your tax advisor about your specific situation.
- If awarded the scholarship, the amount may be reduced if your unmet need (i.e., your Cost of Attendance minus other scholarships and grants) is less than the scholarship.
